The restaurant boasts a 60 seat mezzanine, a great fireplace, and has the best and biggest patio on "The Stroll". The restaurant and patio seat up to 300 people comfortably, so large groups can be easily accommodated.

## Edgewater

This little gem on the west shore of Green Lake, three kilometres north of Whistler's Main Village, is a haunt of movie stars in the know and of chatty TV chefs made dumb by the elegance of the menu. The whole east side of the Edgewater with its sweeping view across the lake to the majesty of the Coast Mountains will lose out for attention once your choices arrive at table. Pastas, seafood, venison and lamb characterize the menu.

The dining room, with vaulted ceilings and head-turning views, is famous for its fabulous cuisine including "chef's rambles," venison with herb béarnaise, seared Camembert and fig mousse.



## Garibaldi Lift Company
